

Queen's Birthday Honour for Cove Resident



On Friday September 13, when the Governor of New South Wales was awarding the prestigious **Order of Australia Medals (OAM)** one of our own was on the receiving line. Flinders resident John Young was awarded the medal for his services to the community of Pennant Hills. John was nominated for the award by three members of the Pennant Hills Golf Club; Dr Ian Fitzpatrick, Alistair Robertson and Don Melrose.

Before moving to the Cove in 2001, John and his wife Beverly spent around forty years in the Pennant Hills District. It was there that he carried out his service (over a period of around 25 years) as a member of the Pennant Hills Rotary Club. John was Vice President three times and Sergeant-at-arms five times. He was also the International Service Director and Assistant Director, Assistant Community Service Director and Conference Chairman. John has been the Chairman of the Pennant Hills Zone Red Shield Appeal since 1988 and was the President of the Commercial Vehicles Industry Association of Australia for a number of years.

Her Excellency Professor Marie Bashir AC CVO presented John with the OAM at Sydney's Government House. He enjoyed refreshments on the Colonnade after the presentation with Beverly (pictured) and their two children Murray and Fiona. John attributes his success to the support of Beverly, he says, "without whom none of this would have been possible."

The Order of Australia, instituted by Her Majesty The Queen on 14 February 1975, was established as "an Australian society of honour for the purpose of according recognition to Australian citizens and other persons for achievement or for meritorious service". On 24 May 1976 the *Medal of the Order* in both the General Division and Military Division was added.

After the spinal injury and tragic death of her uncle Peter Bilsborough, Cove resident Tracey Roberts set out to raise awareness on paralysis through her first book *The Will to Live, The Courage to Die*. She also set about raising the funds for chin controlled wheelchairs for Royal North Shore Hospital (RNSH). (refer previous editions).

In May this year, with the assistance and backing of Five Dock Rotary Club, a staggering \$120,000 was raised. The money was used to buy seven wheelchairs: three with chin control and up-to-the minute technology and four non-motorised chairs. All seven were officially handed over to Royal North Shore Hospital on September 13.

The funds were also used to establish an ongoing maintenance repair program. If anyone has or knows of anyone with an unwanted wheelchair, Tracey will arrange pick up (repair if necessary) and donation to nursing homes and palliative care patients. So far four second hand wheelchairs have been successfully reissued.

Tracey's fund raising efforts have been presented to Parliament House by the Honourable Anthony Roberts for documentation in Hansard and John Sidoti MP has nominated Tracey for **NSW Woman of the Year** for the Drummoyne electorate.

A brass plaque (as pictured) was placed on each of the seven wheelchairs given to RNSH to commemorate Tracey's uncle and the legacy inspired from his passing.
